


Who voted in the past presidential election (2016) in North Dakota?




61% of North Dakota voting age population voted in the past presidential election (2016).

Older people were more likely to vote than younger people.



Higher levels of education translated into higher levels of voting.



Non-Hispanic white people voted at higher rates than people of other races and ethnicities.




Women voted at slightly higher rates than men.



People with higher family incomes voted at higher rates than people with lower family incomes.
